

Supplications Mentioned During Today's Khutbah 3/6/2020

1. Abu Huraira reported that a person came to Allah's Messenger (ﷺ) and said: "Allah's Messenger, I was stung by a scorpion during the night. Thereupon he said: Had you recited these words in the evening: A'Udhzu Bi Kalimaatillahit-Taammaat Amin Sharri Maa Khalaaq

"I seek refuge in the Perfect Word of Allah from the evil of what He created," it would not have done any harm to you. Muslim 2709

2. 'Abdullah b. Umar reported that Allah's Messenger (ﷺ) supplicated in these words: Allahumma Inni A'Udhzu Bika Amin Zawaal Ni'matik Wa Tahawwul Aafiyatik Wa Fuja'ati Niqmatik Wa Jami' Sakhatik

"O Allah, I seek refuge with you from the withdrawal of your blessing and the loss of health and from the sudden onset of your wrath, and from everything that leads to your anger." Muslim 2739

3. Aban bin Uthman said:

"I heard Uthman bin Affan [may Allah be pleased with him] saying:

'The Messenger of Allah said: "There is no worshipper who says, in the morning of every day, and the evening of every night: 'In the Name of Allah, who with His Name, nothing in the earth or the heavens can cause harm, and He is the Hearing, the Knowing (Bismillah, Alladhi La Yadurru Ma`a Ismihi Shai'un Fil-Ardi Wa La Fis-Sama', Wa Huwas-Sami`ul Alim)' – three times, (except that) nothing shall harm him." And Aban had been stricken with a type of semi-paralysis, so a man began to look at him, so Aban said to him, "What are you looking at? Indeed the Hadith is as I reported it to you, but I did not say it one day, so Allah brought about His decree upon me." At-Tirmidhzi 3388

4. Narrated Anas ibn Malik:

The Prophet ﷺ used to say: Allahumma Inni A'Udhzu Bika Min Al-Baras Wal-Junoon Wal-Judhzaam Wa Min Sayyiul-Asqaam
